2017 Grades 3-8 ELA and Math Assessment Results:

- ELA scores rose 1.9% over last year, Math up 1.1%
- Refusal rate lower than last year by 2%

NYSED to Assist At-Risk Students by Offering \$17 Million in Grants to 44 Colleges

- Liberty Partnerships Program (LPP) helps students stay in school and continue on to higher education

Grants help colleges work with the community around them to attain positive influences to keep kids in school

- Helps kids who may not have support at home
- To be eligible for grant, the institute must be:
 - A school eligible for programs under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) or
 - A school with at least 40% of students eligible for free or reduced lunch or
 - A school identified as struggling, a focus, or dangerous or
 - A rural school with students at risk AND
 - Be affiliated with a Community Based Organization

Board of Regents approves New York Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) plan:

- Next step is submission to United States Education Department (USDE). After feedback, final approval expected early next year.
- Board of Regents Chancellor Rosa commits to helping all students regardless of where they are from or what challenges they face to succeed and thrive in school.
- Plan to continue to engage with stakeholders and other community members to make everyone comfortable with changes
- Plan expands measures for school support, student success, and accountability. School improvement plans for lowest performing schools overall as well as schools with particular student populations
- Also includes support of professional growth for educators to provide a well-rounded and accepting environment upon which students can succeed.

Board of Regents Approves Next Generation Learning Standards in English Language Arts and Mathematics:

- After 2 years of revisions with input from educators, stakeholders and parents from across the state- changes still maintain academic rigor
- NYSED will work with BOCES, district superintendents, saff, and teacher centers offering professional development for teachers to carry out the changes
